Due to the impacts of COVID-19 globally, One Young World established a fund for immediate distribution to young leaders on the front lines of the COVID- 19 response.

This survey seeks to support the COVID-19 Young Leaders Fund. One Young World surveyed 1,000+ young people in 60+ countries to understand how they were being affected by COVID-19 and how best the COVID-19 Young Leaders Fund can support communities globally.

Interestingly, a vast majority (82%) of respondents have not attended a One Young World Summit, and responses are indicative of voices beyond One Young World's direct community of Ambassadors.




Survey findings indicate that young people are continuing to spearhead activism globally as a staggering 72% of young people have volunteered their time to help others during this pandemic.

Nearly two thirds of young people surveyed (64%) do not believe that their country's leadership is doing enough to support young people during this time of crisis, and more than half want to see more international cooperation to tackle the virus and support communities.

Despite current challenges, almost 90% of young people are hopeful for the future.


Are you a key worker on the front line of COVID-19?






How are young people being affected most by COVID-19?

Young people are most worried about their health and employment opportunities amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. They also indicated that they were worried about inequalities being exacerbated as a result of the pandemic, with food insecurity, the ability to access and understand government guidelines, and forms of abuse being the most common forms of this.

- Health (22.77%)
- Mental health (15.05%)
- Family situation (11.76%)
- Relationships (1.41%)
- Impact on education (13.92%)
- Employment opportunities (20.79%)
- Other (14.3%)
