Introduction

One Young World's mission is to create a world where leaders with integrity are empowered to build a fair, peaceful and sustainable future for all. Every year, One Young World achieves this by inspiring, building and elevating the world's most impactful young leaders.

This final evaluation report on the One Young World - European Commission collaboration regarding the initiative entitled: Empowering Youth for Positive Change outlines all details of the work executed to meet the objectives set up in the Phase V contract:

- Building the capacity of young people from conflict-affected environments to prevent all forms of violent extremism and to contribute to Positive Peace
- Elevating the profile and credibility of young people taking action • to advance Positive Peace
- Strengthening the European Commission's recognition as a • supporter of young people's role in the peace, stability, and conflict prevention agenda.

Through various programmes and initiatives, the final outcomes of these objectives as measured against the anticipated results and the work executed throughout the programme is detailed in this report.

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
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Launching the Scholarship: Identifying

Target: 1,000 applications in four weeks



One Young World launched the 2022 Peace Ambassador Scholarship on a dedicated webpage, encouraging young leaders from across the world to apply. The One Young World Team conducted individual outreach to potential candidates online through social media sources such as LinkedIn, Google Search, Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook.

Additionally, One Young World works with a wide network of partners and supporters to ensure that the brightest young leaders from around the world are able to participate in the annual Summit. Therefore, One Young World leveraged the One Young World network of Nominating Supporters who were asked to nominate suitable candidates in their network.

The nominating supporters contacted for the Peace Ambassador programme include IREX, Atlas Corps, Change Now, The Youth Cafe, Raleigh International, Diana Award, Liberty in North Korea, and Girls not Brides. One Young World also contacted the existing Peace Ambassador network to spread the news of this year's scholarship launch. As a result, 424 of the applicants came through nominations.


Likewise, the scholarship was heavily advertised across One Young World's social media platforms, including Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn and Instagram, reaching:

Over 4,000 applicants heard about the scholarship through One Young World social media channels

The Peace Ambassador Scholarship application form was open for three weeks, from 24 May 2022 to 16 June 2022. The original timeline had the scholarship opening in the first week of May and would remain open for four weeks. One Young World made the decision to close the application early due to the overwhelming number of applications received.

The target was to receive 1,000 applications over the timeframe of four weeks. We are incredibly pleased to share that in only three weeks, One Young World received a total of 6,185 application submissions from 151 countries. 62 percent of the applicants identified as male and 38 percent as female, with a handful of applicants identifying as other.




In an effort to promote inclusivity and allow participants to apply in another language, One Young World launched the scholarship application in five different languages: English, Spanish, French, Arabic, and Russian;

- 90% of applicants applied in English,
- 5% in Arabic,
- 4% in French,
- 1% in Spanish and Russian

As all of One Young World's annual programming is conducted in English, a basic understanding of English is required to participate in the Peace Ambassador Programme. Applicants were therefore asked about their English proficiency in the application.

One Young World reviewed all applications and provided a shortlist of the best profiles to the European Commission, from which the 50 strongest champions from across 41 nationalities were selected in the field of P/CVE and peacebuilding. This year's group consisted of 46 Scholars and 4 Returning Ambassadors. During the onboarding phase of the 2022 cohort, some initially chosen Peace Ambassadors had to be replaced due to matters such as travel restrictions, visa issues or personal circumstances. Eventually 40 Peace Ambassadors attended the 2022 Manchester Summit in-person, while 10 attended via our digital platform Hubilo.

Launching the Scholarship: Selecting



The One Young World Team carefully read through the candidates' profiles, identifying the applicants who had a track-record of leadership and had taken action that demonstrated measurable impact in their local communities.

The One Young World Team ensured that the candidate pool represented diverse geographical and socioeconomic backgrounds and met the criteria of the scholarship. 50 young leaders active in the fields of P/CVE and peacebuilding from 41 countries were selected to join the programme.

Scholars were selected in the following countries:





On-boarding: Welcome Event

A month before the Summit, on Tuesday 2 August, One Young World hosted two Welcome Events for the 2022 cohort of the European Commission Peace Ambassadors. These calls took place at 09:00 AM and 16:00 PM BST to ensure all ambassadors were able to participate in a session.

The purpose of this event was to introduce One Young World, the European Commission, and the Peace Ambassador Programme to the cohort. It was also an important event in preparing the Ambassadors for the Summit, providing them with an outline of what to expect at the Summit, and useful information on travelling to the UK. Moreover, this event enabled networking opportunities between the Ambassadors through breakout sessions and interactive polls, as well as connecting with former Peace Ambassadors who were able to share their experiences of the Peace Ambassador Programme and the Summit.

In addition to this Welcome Event, the 50 Peace Ambassadors had the opportunity to take part in an onboarding process led by the Community Team at One Young World. To help Scholars and Delegates prepare for the four-day event, they joined Zoom calls each month leading up to the Manchester 2022 Summit. This equipped them with the knowledge, advice and informal connections that would enable them to maximise their time in Manchester and beyond. These sessions were 1 hour long and held twice a day to accommodate multiple time zones.

Result 2:

The selected young leaders are empowered through their participation in the One Young World Global Summit 05-08 September 2022.

One Young World is the global community for young leaders. It inspires young leaders to increase their social impact, builds their skills and capacity, and elevates their profiles both locally and globally.

Our annual One Young World Summit convenes these young leaders, known as Delegates and Scholars, from **190+ countries** to develop solutions to the world's big challenges. They connect, share learnings, and get inspired by political, business and humanitarian leaders such as **Justin Trudeau**, **Paul Polman and Mary Robinson**. The agenda is shaped by the young people and the One Young World Community through the Global Consultation Process, ensuring maximum relevance every year.

Delegates and Scholars return to their communities and organisations as **One Young World Ambassadors** with the connections, insights, and motivation to act, accessing the **global community of 15,200+ young leaders** to accelerate existing social impact initiatives or establish new ventures.

2022 Selected Peace Ambassadors Feedback

The following data was collected from the responses of 187 Scholars, of whom 21 were 2022 selected Peace Ambassador Scholars.

Summit Participation and Engagement

One Young World is extremely pleased with this year's participation from the European Commission at the 2022 Summit, exceeding the commitments One Young World had with the European Commission to ensure presence at the One Young World Summit. As part of these commitments, the European Commission was going to have one representative speak in a Presentation Stage Panel, three Delegate Speakers on stage, as well as host an Interactive Stage Session.

One Young World is happy to share that the European Commission had a presence at this year's Summit in two Presentation Stage Panels and four Delegate Speakers keynotes. Moreover, the European Commission hosted an Interactive Stage Session with two Peace Ambassadors.

One Young World is also pleased to share that two additional Peace Ambassadors were invited to take part in two more Interactive Stage Sessions. Throughout the Summit, One Young World provided development opportunities to an extended number of Peace Ambassadors.

European Commission Keynote Speech on Presentation Stage

Mr. Peter Wagner, Director - Head of the Service for Foreign Policy Instruments (FPI) on Disinformation joined digitally to give a keynote speech on Disinformation. As One Young World is keen to explore closer relationships with the European Commission, this session was highly appreciated by both the Ambassadors and One Young World staff.

European Commission Spotlight Session on Presentation Stage

The European Commission Spotlight Session touched on the threats to "International Security: Establishing a Global Response". This session was moderated by Antonio Zappulla, CEO of the Thomson Reuters Foundation, who shared the stage with Aaron Atimpe, Manager at Star Ghana Foundation and One Young World and European Commission Peace Ambassador, Hanna Liubakova, Belarusian journalist, researcher, television presenter and activist and Mr. Simon Bojsen-Møller, Acting Deputy Head of Unit Rapid Response, Africa and the Middle East, European Commission who joined digitally.



"It is important to leverage different media outlets that are available to communities, it doesn't have to be in official languages, it has to be in language that people feel comfortable with. Bring the local and central government officials and let them interact with local communities. It doesn't have to be radio or TV...in indigenous communities have their own way of spreading and taking in information. We need to identify, strengthen and use these platforms."

Peace Ambassador Delegate Speakers: Conflict Resolution Plenary Session

The Delegate Speaker role is a chance for Delegates to share their story on stage to like-minded young leaders, world leaders, representatives of partner organisations and international media, as well as a global audience who followed the Summit via our livestream, or watched retrospectively via Hubilo (Summit digital platform), Facebook, Twitter and our YouTube/Vimeo channel.

This unique opportunity was only extended to 32 Delegates this year. The selected Delegate Speakers received dedicated training in public speaking over a period of two months ahead of the Summit. Six Delegate Speakers were selected for the Conflict Plenary Session to share their work and experiences. Four of the six Delegate Speakers were from the One Young World and European Commission Peace Ambassadors Programme due to the outstanding guality of the Peace Ambassadors' profiles. This has been to date the largest number of Delegate Speakers from the same programme to take part in a Plenary Session.

During the Manchester Summit, the selected Peace Ambassadors participated in general Summit programming, including the Summit Plenary Session on Conflict Prevention: How can we prevent conflicts?

Aigerim Fazylova from Kazakhstan, Daniel Shirma from Kenya, Jaiksana Soro from South Sudan, and Jin Davod from Syria spoke during the Plenary Session on Conflict Resolution, where they addressed how we can identify future conflicts and avoid conflicts from re-emerging.

Aigerim Fazylova has over 10 years of experience in the area of peacebuilding, conflict resolution, tackling disinformation across the EMEA region. At Global Shapers Hub, they launched an awareness-raising campaign to address the issue of disinformation. They spread factsheets and brochures online and offline, debunking deliberately misleading information. During the first week, the campaign reached 10,000 online users.

Daniel Shirima is the founder and managing director of the community radio project Kijee Radio and TV, a youth-run initiative which promotes peace and growth through film-making and education. Through it, he has run peace projects partnering with Ocean Recovery Alliance, Life and Peace Institute, Kenya Redcross Society, Horn for Africa for countering violent extremism and Amani People's Theatre.

"They said because my family had a history of crime, I would follow the same rough path. But I told myself if no-one will change my community, I will be the one to do it, for this is my story. I realized that despite everything, Majengo is a rich slum full of self-motivated people, humble families, hard-working youths. Our only fault was being born in a hostile environment we didn't choose."

Jaiksana Soro 🔁 South Sudan

Founder of the O-Space Innovation Hub in Yei, South Sudan, Jaiksana was forced to move to the Rhino Camp refugee settlement in Uganda due to armed conflicts in 2016. He created a project called #defyhatenow to increase awareness in the camps where they train and create a teacher's toolkit which can be used in conflict anywhere. In fact-checking workshops, they turn locals into "misinformation police", reducing their susceptibility to fake news by teaching them to verify information and to spread the credible variety. Over 1,500 refugees have attended these training programs so far.

"Global peace seems an increasingly elusive prospect, and part of the problem with disinformation online is that it is disconnected from reality. It is easy to write and spread disinformation without feeling the consequences, but the consequences are real and they are tragic. We must deal with this urgently. We need disinformation and hate speech on the global agenda and off our screens."

Jin Davod Syria

Jin is a Syrian refugee residing in Turkey. Drawing on her experience with mental health issues surviving the war in Syria, Jin wanted to do something to help other refugees around her still suffering from psychological problems and struggling to continue their lives. Jin founded the Peace Therapist Enterprise and Peace Software, a platform that provides free therapy with expert psychologists in any language, whenever and wherever they want, without the requirement of revealing one's identity. The platform specifically targets refugees traumatised by war.

"When I came to Turkey, a safe country, I thought the war would be over for me. But it had just moved from outside to inside of me. I tried to calm down but I found I couldn't. I thought a sniper would shoot me. I was so full of fear and trauma, I couldn't leave the house. For a year, I just sat in an empty room and wished for my happy childhood, my friends, my school."

Interactive Stage

Conflict in the Age of Disinformation hosted by European Commission

This year the European Commission hosted an Interactive Stage Session on Wednesday 7 September. The session was moderated by Dr Jaane Talaas, Chief Executive Officer, CMI – Martti Ahtisaari Peace Foundation. In addition, One Young World and European Commission Peace Ambassadors Viktor Gurskyi, CEO and Co-founder at SocialBoost and Nyadi Francios, Executive Director of One Peace Cameroon took part as paxnellists to address the issue of "Conflict in the Age of Disinformation".



Additional Peace Ambassador Speaking Opportunities

Likewise, Jin Davod, Founder of Peace Therapist and Jean Linis-Dinco, PhD in Cybersecurity-Digital Media at UNSW (Moderator), both One Young World and European Commission Peace Ambassadors, took part in two other Interactive Sessions. Jin Davod joined as a panellist the session on "Migration and Integration: Fostering Welcoming Communities" and Jean Linis-Dinco moderated the session on "Journalism, Accountability and Democracy".



Development and Networking Opportunities

Following the request of the European Commission to produce digital content for the One Young World Summit Digital Platform, One Young World curated a panel discussion with Patryk Pawlak, European Union Institute for Security Studies Brussels Executive Officer and Bejay Mulenga, Founder of Supa Network and Executive Director of The Student View. The session was moderated by One Young World Ambassador Jean de Dieu Cirhigiri, Former Project Officer for the EU and North America at Heinrich Boell Foundation.

In addition to sessions on the Presentation Stage, Interactive Stages and Digital Platform, the 2022 Peace Ambassadors took part in various networking breaks, such as an Exclusive Roundtable with the Duke and Duchess of Sussex, Harry and Meghan, and different Mentor Sessions.

One Young World organised the Exclusive Roundtable for exceptional One Young World Ambassadors to discuss the different ways to achieve gender equality. Out of over 2,000 people who attended the Summit, eight Ambassadors were invited to join this exclusive event, including One Young World and European Commission Peace Ambassador, Ireen Chikatula.



To better connect the young leaders at the annual Summits with the expertise offered by One Young World Counsellors, the One Young World team organises exclusive, invitation-only Mentor Sessions in which intimate groups can share experiences, challenges and solutions. At this year's Summit in Manchester, 146 young leaders were invited to Mentor Sessions, from which 20 were Peace Ambassadors.

The 20 Peace Ambassadors were invited to participate in 10 different Mentor Sessions with One Young World Counsellors such as Dr Alaa Murabit, UN High-Level Commissioner on Health, Employment & Economic Growth and Director of Health at the Gates Foundation; Michael Møller, Former Director-General of United National in Geneva; Lord Hastings, Chair SOAS University of London; Monica de Greiff, Colombian Ambassador to Kenya, among others.

Increasing visibility at the Summit

To ensure higher levels of engagement of the European Commission's participation during the Summit, the Communications Team at One Young World covered the Summit through One Young World's different social media platforms, including photos from the event and speeches made by the European Commission and Peace Ambassador Delegate Speakers. Twitter threads for all sessions on the Presentation Stage were shared, highlighting inspirational moments from that session including quotes, and enabling the audience to follow the Summit through the social media platforms to engage with the sessions. This allowed greater engagement from youth worldwide to share, like, comment and repost.


The average engagement rate for both the European Commission presentation stage sessions was 1.94% with a total of 513 engagements and 26,407 impressions on Twitter.

Similarly, photos and quotes from the speeches made by the Peace Ambassador Delegate Speakers were also promoted. Twitter threads for all four speeches of the Peace Ambassadors were shared, highlighting inspirational moments from their speeches enabling the audience following the Summit through the social media platforms to engage with the sessions, allowing greater engagement from youth worldwide to share, like, comment and repost. 





Result 3:

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Increased engagement and understanding of the European Commission's peace and stability agenda through a study visit to the EU institutions in Brussels.

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One Young World co-developed a two-day study visit to the European Commission headquarters in Brussels, Belgium, as part of the European Union Visitors Programme (EUVP). The EUVP is a young leaders program that invites delegates with a career-related interest in the EU to visit Europe and gain a first-hand appreciation of the EU's institutions, policies, and values. The EUVP is jointly sponsored and administered by the European Parliament and the European Commission. This study visit is an integral component of the One Young World Peace Ambassador Programme, supporting young leaders' role in the peace, stability and conflict prevention agenda.


During the EUVP visit, Peace Ambassadors had the opportunity to connect with fellow participants in the One Young World Peace Ambassadors Programme, hear from officials from the European Commission, European Parliament, European Council and European External Action Service, as well as participate in workshops to further support their peacebuilding work. Ambassadors were lucky enough to observe the work of one of the European Parliament's committee meetings.

Over the two days, Ambassadors participated in sessions on 'Countering violent extremism', 'Migration and Human Security', 'Cybersecurity and digital strategy' and other fascinating topics related to the EU's strategic policies. They heard from different Heads of Departments, economists, and key figureheads of the European Commission. The study visit gave Ambassadors the opportunity to hear from key players in the European Commission while also sharing their thoughts and experiences in the peace, stability and conflict prevention space.

EUVP Ambassador Feedback

Eight Peace Ambassadors who participated in the EUVP provided feedback and gave the programme an average rating of 4.9/5.

These Peace Ambassadors were also asked to gauge their agreement with statements related to the impact of the programme. All of the Ambassadors agreed or strongly agreed with these statements.

Result 4:

Increased understanding of the young leaders of the role and impact of communication in shaping perceptions and of disinformation in leading to extremist violence.



Summit Workshops

In an effort to increase the Peace Ambassadors' understanding on the role and impact of communication in shaping perceptions and the role of disinformation that can lead to extremist violence, One Young World organised a unique and exclusive workshop for the Peace Ambassadors at the Summit.



During the Manchester Summit, there were a total of 48 workshops carried out in person and 18 digital workshops. This year, the Peace Ambassadors attended an exclusive workshop hosted specifically for them by the European Commission. In this workshop, the 50 young peacebuilders were trained by the Institute for Strategic Dialogue (ISD) on disinformation and potential responses. The goal was for the young peacebuilders to have a better understanding of disinformation and its consequences in a global context, enhanced knowledge of strategic project planning, enhanced understanding of interventions to counteract disinformation and its consequences and inspire them to pursue initiatives to counter disinformation. To allow for both in-person and digital participation, the workshop was held in a hybrid format.



Result 5:

Increased empowerment and visibility - Participation in Workshops/ Conferences throughout the initiative.



One Young World has been working to elevate the profiles of the Peace Ambassadors as well as building their capacity as young leaders to advance Positive Peace. The One Young World Community Team works year-round to track community impact, organise events, facilitate local networking events, spark opportunities for collaboration, and provide growth opportunities through mentorship, funding programmes and media exposure.

As part of our commitments with the European Commission to empower the Peace Ambassadors and increase their visibility, One Young World carried out a three-part video series and engaged them in different development programs and Community activities, as shown below.

Increase Visibility

Three-part Video Series


With the commitment to elevate the profile and credibility of young people taking action to advance Positive Peace, One Young World delivered a three-part online video series featuring selected Peace Ambassadors in discussion with EC representatives, with the target for each video to reach 1M views.

To successfully achieve the commitment, One Young World identified Peace Ambassadors from the 2022 cohort with expertise in the three focus topics of the Video Series; Conflict Resolution, Disinformation, and Violent Extremism.

Each video was recorded over Zoom with two Peace Ambassadors in conversation with a representative from the European Commission. Once the video had been edited and tested to optimise engagement, the video was posted and promoted on One Young World's social media channels, elevating the work of the Peace Ambassadors while raising awareness of important issues related to peace. Each video of the Peace Ambassador Video Series was launched with one week's period in between as part of the communications campaign and then promoted on social media for further engagement.

Episode 1: Conflict Resolution

How can we as a global community prevent and resolve global conflict?

By May 2022, more than 100 million people were forcibly displaced worldwide by persecution, conflict, violence, human rights violations or events seriously disturbing public order.

More than 42% of One Young World Ambassadors surveyed in 2021 have experienced conflict or violence in their lifetime. Out of these respondents, almost 33% attributed the conflict and unrest in their country to economic issues such as poverty, inequality and inflation.

In this session two One Young World Peace Ambassadors joined Barbara Matias, EC Representative to discuss conflict resolution. Some of the key takeaways from Episode 1 were:

- We must address root causes of conflict to overcome persisting types of discrimination, for example restricted access to education and economic differences.
- We must ensure **gender-based violence crimes** is given the proper attention that it deserves, and a justice system that holds people and countries accountable.
- Engaging youth and engaging women in peacebuilding, mediation and conflict rehabilitation is crucial.
- Women in particular should be recognised as leaders, and included in any peacebuilding discussions to realise a more comprehensive and sustainable perspective on conflict resolution.

One Young World Peace Ambassadors

Jaiksana Soro was forced to move to the Rhino Camp refugee settlement in Uganda due to armed conflicts in 2016. There he founded Platform Africa, a community-based organisation engaged in reaching young refugees through the power of media, education and technology to foster equitable, informed and resilient societies. As a lead #defyhatenow correspondent, Jaiksana has been running workshops on social media literacy, trauma and hate speech mitigation.

Jin Davod is a Syrian refugee residing in Turkey. Drawing on her experience with mental health issues surviving the war in Syria, Jin wanted to do something to help other refugees around her still suffering from psychological problems and struggling to continue their lives. Jin founded the Peace Therapist Enterprise and Peace Software, a platform that provides free therapy with expert psychologists in any language, whenever and wherever they want, without the requirement of revealing one's identity. The platform specifically targets refugees traumatised by war.

Episode 2: Tackling Disinformation

How do we recognise and combat disinformation?

The mass adoption of social media, the quick and easy spread of information, and the digitisation of the news are all driving factors for the rise of disinformation as a crucial political and military tool by governments, organisations and people around the world.

In this session, two One Young World Peace Ambassadors joined Barbara Matias, EC Representative, to discuss disinformation. Key takeaways from Episode 2 were:

- There are a lot of gaps in the international human rights law around disinformation. Moreso, there is a lacking consensus of what disinformation is. We must start by raising awareness and have a consensus on the concept to address and tackle disinformation.
- Our power as civilians is in our **critical thinking**.
- Disinformation is a dangerous tool. The constant exposure to disinformation has been linked to mental health, and increased accessibility to proponents of radicalisation and extremism.
- We must focus on educating civilians and boost grassroot movements in order to develop critical thinking in a fastpaced digital age.

As a senior advisor, Aigerim also provided strategic counselling to the world's largest tech companies on key policy profiles such as the Digital Services Act, online content regulation, election integrity, and trust & safety across the EMEA region.

Jean Linis-Dinco is a human rights activist in the Philippines. In 2014, Jean directed Rainbow X-a film about the rising hate crimes against transgender people in the Philippines. The film won the Top Award from the International Association of Business Communicators in the same year. In 2018, Jean was selected as a Global Innovator for the Human Rights Campaign Global Innovative Advocacy Summit in Washington D.C. where she spoke about the role of film in raising awareness of LGBTQ community. Jean's work in the field of technology and human rights was acknowledged in 2022 when she was awarded by the Women in AI Ethics™ (WAIE) as one of the top 100 Women in Artificial Intelligence Ethics globally.

Episode 3: Countering Violent Extremism

How can we prevent and counter the ubiquitous threat of violent extremism?

Conflict remains the primary driver of terrorism, with more than 99% of all terrorist-related deaths occurring in countries involved in a violent conflict or with high levels of political terror. With unprecedented access to the general public through the internet, extremist groups today are able to carry out more efficient and effective recruitment, incitement, and propaganda, as well as the purchase of weapons and unregulated money transfers.

In this session, two One Young World Peace Ambassadors joined Joana Deus Pereira, EC Representative, to discuss violent extremism. Key takeaways from Episode 3 were:

- Violent extremism is of transnational nature, that is not confined by borders and affects everyone.
- Youth and gender should be included and integrated in any P/CVE strategy implemented in countries directly affected by violent extremism.
- Education plays a key role in achieving peace and countering violent extremism. We must direct more resources to capacity-building tools and increase resilience amongst local communities.
- We must tailor-design P/CVE programmes. There is no "one shoes fits all" solution, because each case will be different in terms of underlying causes and motivations.

One Young World Peace Ambassadors

Aaron Atimpe is an international development practitioner and has worked on various thematic areas with experience in programme management, policy, and research, monitoring & evaluation, and learning (RMEL) across both the public sector and civil society. He has expertise in P/CVE programming and is experienced in leading community-driven conflict resolution and transformation, as well as community-security relations. Aaron currently works with a Ghanaian civil society organisation, STAR Ghana Foundation, as a Manager for conflicts, security and stability programmes.

Aminu Aisha Marafa has an interest in empowering the girl-child and ensuring that there is peace across Nigeria led her to founding the WEGIRLS DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION. The foundation works towards peace and reconciliation, tackling gender-based violence and empowering women. Aisha has worked on various humanitarian projects; helping victims of violence, banditry and insurgency through the provision of health support interventions, education, peacebuilding, drug abuse and trauma healing and psycho-social support in the Northwestern part of Nigeria.

Dr. Joana de Deus Pereira is Senior Research Fellow at RUSI Europe specialising in Counter-Terrorism and P/CVE. She has particular expertise in the realms of geopolitical and country-risk analysis in sub-Saharan Africa. Joana has also been engaged as an EU project evaluator for over three years and has deep experience in risk and security analysis with a focus on CT and P/CVE issues.

Building capacities and community engagement

Action accelerator

The Action Accelerator was created by four young leaders who, upon meeting at the One Young World Summit Bogotá, 2017, quickly identified an opportunity to help fellow young leaders move from inspiration to action across the UN Global Goals.

The Action Accelerator covers a different topic each month - from vision setting, to pitching and storytelling - and has both an intrapreneurship and entrepreneurship stream, making it valuable to Ambassadors generating social impact in every industry and across every issue. Ambassadors attended monthly panels of internationally-recognised expert speakers, who discussed their own journey and gave useful advice on developing a social impact initiative.

22 Peace Ambassadors participated in the 2022/23 Action Accelerator, including 10 Peace Ambassadors from the 2022 selected cohort

2021 selected Peace Ambassador Ambassador Katarina Bošković founded a new programme as a direct result of the Action Accelerator. She has developed educational programmes on peacebuilding and community relations, and has so far impacted over 20,000 young people and 800 teachers from six countries in the western Balkans.

Six-Month Feedback

As part of our commitments with the European Commission, One Young World aims to create a community of more capable and motivated leaders who are empowered to build Positive Peace in their communities. Peace Ambassadors are encouraged to continue their drive and engagement in the One Young World Community to contribute to Positive Peace. Likewise, One Young World aims to provide Peace Ambassadors with the necessary tools and skills to turn knowledge and motivation into action by expanding their initiative or starting a new one.


The feedback collected from Peace Ambassadors all indicated a desire to strengthen relations with the European Commission and continue to grow their network of support for inspiring and reinvigorating them for the challenging work that they do.

With the above in mind, the following statistics are comprised of feedback received from 73 Scholars in total, of whom 11 were 2022 selected Peace Ambassadors.


One Young World follows up with Ambassadors six months after each Summit to document their progress towards generating new social impact and implementing the lessons and benefits they receive through their membership of the One Young World Community. Six months after the 2022 Summit, 78% of Ambassadors reported generating new social impact. This number increases to 82% for 2022 selected Peace Ambassadors.

However, 80% of Ambassadors who engage in additional One Young World programmes beyond the Summit generate social impact. This number increases with the 2022 selected Peace Ambassadors who engage in additional programmes specific to the Peace Ambassador Programme, with 86% generating impact.

Have you participated in any other One Young World programmes since becoming a One Young World Ambassador?




2022 selected Peace Ambassadors were significantly more likely to continue engaging with One Young World Community events after the Summit, with 64% of survey respondents from the Peace Ambassador cohort participating in events and opportunities like the Action Accelerator programme.



2022 selected Peace Ambassadors were also more likely to strongly agree that being a One Young World Ambassador improved their understanding of how to generate social impact in the aftermath of the Summit. 100% of Peace Ambassadors who responded agreed with the statement, while the average level of agreement was 90/100, where 50/100 represented 'Neither Agree nor Disagree' and 100/100 represented 'Strongly Agree'.




In addition to better understanding how to generate impact, 2022 selected Peace Ambassadors also reported strong agreement that being an Ambassador has improved their capacity to generate impact. 89% of 2022 selected Peace Ambassadors who completed the survey agreed, with the average level of agreement amongst them standing at 88/100, where 50/100 represented 'Neither Agree nor Disagree' and 100/100 represented 'Strongly Agree'.



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Feedback from the Ambassador Community

Each year, One Young World consults with its Community via the Global Consultation Process (GCP), to determine which topics, issues and key questions are of the greatest concern to young people around the world.

In 2023, approximately 1,000 young leaders participated and from the findings it is apparent that despite increasingly experiencing the impact of conflict and being concerned about rising hate, young people are optimistic about the future of peace.

Participation by High Level Speakers

In addition, One Young World exceeded the commitment of five high-level speakers. The participants had the opportunity to receive advice from six different experts such as **Professor Thuli Madonsela** on which practical lessons to apply in their own work towards a peaceful future, and listen to Ekaterina Zagladina and Hiba Qasas address Peacebuilding in today's context in conversations with Peace Ambassadors. In the second half of the Community Peace Event, participants heard from and were given the chance to take part in a Q&A with Michael Møller. They also learned from Hanna Liubakova and Hasina Shafi on how we can resolve conflict by increasing the awareness of disinformation in an age of digitalisation, and involving women in peacekeeping discussions at all levels.

Media Coverage

One Young World is extremely happy with this year's Peace Ambassador Programme visibility and coverage, having supported the Peace Ambassadors' development by using One Young World's extensive reach to effectively profile the Ambassadors and highlight their work as peacebuilders through targeted digital and traditional media coverage opportunities. The number of communication products developed has been outstanding, exceeding the target of 30 publications to profile and elevate the work of the Peace Ambassadors.

Scholarship Launch

Following the final selection and onboarding phase, One Young World worked on an official announcement of the 2022 initiative by announcing the cohort on 15 July.

The announcement was relayed by more than

974 pieces of coverage within the following days and included news outlets such as CNBC and Elle.

The announcement had a total potential audience of 1.2 billion

This is the most extensive media outreach in the history of this programme since 2017. In addition, the release of the programme was published in 11 languages giving it global pickup, most prominently in the US, India, Canada, United Arab Emirates and the UK.

One Young World continued their communications line on the website by creating a new layer of the 2022 Peace Ambassadors which can be found here. Next to this, One Young World has continued curating further opportunities for the Peace Ambassadors with key partners such as our PR Agency partner Seven Hills. Seven Hills is continuously working to secure ongoing empowerment and visibility for the 2022 cohort of Peace Ambassadors in local and international news.

In the months leading up to and during the Summit, Seven Hills contacted the Peace Ambassador Cohort to encourage local media coverage and share a Press Outreach Toolkit. One Young World is pleased to share that some of the cohort were responsive to the press toolkit shared with them, using it for social media activity as well as media outreach.

Francisco Cavalcante from Brazil made particularly great use of the press toolkit, featuring in 7 different outlets, all of which referred to the European Commission in their pieces:

- 1. Uren State University of Rio Grande do Norte Newspaper
- 2. Opovo one of the oldest newspapers in Brazil with a circulation of 120,000
- 3. De Fato Online newspaper and a radio agency





At the One Young World Summit in Manchester, 2022 Peace Ambassador Tyra Omeir had the opportunity to connect with One Young World Counsellor, Co-anchor at Noticiero Univision and Co-host at Aquí y Ahora, Ilia Calderón.

Every year, Tyra returns to her home in Nicaragua for Christmas and distributes toys and school supplies to children. Unsurprisingly, the meeting of these two anti-trafficking advocates during the Summit resulted in a big win for social impact. Tyra has continued to engage and work with Ilia Calderón that has led to an exciting collaboration, where Ilia offered to contribute towards Tyra's project, which has grown from 500 boxes to 900 boxes



As part of our commitment to engage and profile the Peace Ambassador's achievements and projects we documented and promoted on our social media channels Tyra's journey while she distributed the boxes and collaborated with Ilia. We documented this journey in a two part video, which we promoted on Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn.



On Instagram, both posts had an average engagement rate of 11.5% and a combined 21,982 engagements and 131,140 impressions.



On Facebook, both posts had an average engagement rate of 18.85% and a combined 59,706 engagements and 203,259 impressions.

He also discussed how important One Young World has been for his work. around peacebuilding, finding a platform to share his art with young people and telling his story with other young people.



Impact Report : One Young World Peace Ambassadors

One Young World's Annual Impact Report (available upon request) showcases over 75 Ambassadorled initiatives across every region and industry. The Report utilises both gualitative and guantitative methodologies to analyse Ambassador-led initiatives. 5.77 million people were directly impacted by Ambassador-led projects featured in the 2022 Report, generating \$1.3 billion of social value.

A significant amount of this social impact was generated by Peace Ambassadors featured in the 2022 Impact Report, with the five Peace Ambassadors receiving quantitative analyses of the work having an average social return on investment of 1:22. This means that for every \$1 invested into their initiatives, Peace Ambassadors featured in the 2022 One Young World Impact Report generate \$22 of social value for their stakeholders.



Axle International Benazir Hilali - Comoros 🖿

Co-founded by Benazir, Axle International leverages technological innovations from the private sector to support development in Africa, by identifying socioeconomic and governance risks and developing tools to gather accurate and real-time data. The company has also provided primary data and analytics on public opinion and consumer insights to uncover sociopolitical risks, and has assisted several peace processes across the continent.

Axle International launched the African Risk Compass on public perceptions of socioeconomic and political risks. The initial consultations, which One Young World supported, brought together young people from every region of the continent and gathered insights, data, and thought leadership on topics relevant to human security and risk. Axle International is now building a data platform to crowdsource perceptions and offer open source, transparent, and interactive primary data and insights to humanitarian organisations and governments. The initiative maintains a predictive approach to crisis analysis, and the data comes from an African perspective.

Axle International has so far gathered 2,000 data points from 40 countries and identified 150 developmental risks. It has produced several reports that have been shared with African Union member states, and worked with more than 50 NGOs and universities across the continent. In 2020, Benazir and her co-founder, Nathaniel Jowitt, received the Top Innovation of the Year in Democracy and Governance granted by the African Union and COMESA.



Ahmed attended the One Young World Summit in Munich 2021, as a European Commission Peace Ambassador. He was a signatory of the "Declaration on the future of Peacebuilding and Leadership", along with his fellow Peace Ambassadors, which was published on International Peace Day in 2021. As a result of his One Young World experience, Ahmed made important connections, and was able to leverage his growing network to continue developing as a young leader.

SMART Liberia maintains its own space, known as the Changemakers Village, which has emerged as a hub for young people from all walks of life to come together and pursue their dreams and entrepreneurial ideas. It also functions as a co-working space. Through their Education Advancement Project they have supported 34 students to study abroad on fully or partially funded scholarships, with SMART Liberia providing advice and preparatory aid throughout their application process. The organisation has also been instrumental in the launch and incubation of 40 new businesses in Liberia through its incubation programme, while 100 university graduates have successfully gotten internships through SMART Liberia's Job Readiness programme. In addition to these landmark projects, the organisation has hosted several other events in entrepreneurial spaces, reaching over 2,000 people.

Oluwafunke attended the One Young World Summit in Munich, 2021. Listening to other Ambassadors, as well as her participation on a digital panel with Robert Spano, Former President of the European Court of Human Rights, motivated Oluwafunke to scale her work towards facilitating systemic change. She has since now partnered with the Ministry of Justice and the Legal Aid Council to address issues of false imprisonment and prisoner's rights.

Hope Behind Bars has so far directly impacted over 7,000 people. Of these, 397 people have received free direct legal support, while 4,000 have gone through the organisation's welfare intervention, skills empowerment and reintegration programmes. In partnership with the Cornell University Centre on the Death Penalty, Hope Behind Bars has provided capacity-building training to 200 lawyers and law students. They have also leveraged technology to create legal awareness to more than 2,000 individuals to help them know and assert their rights. Oluwafunke has also co-authored learning resources for pro-bono lawyers. Hope Behind Bars trained women in prison in tailoring and sewing, who made around 1,400 reusable face masks during the pandemic. The organisation has developed an app to connect lawyers with pro-bono work, with over 1,000 users. Since its founding, Hope Behind Bars has saved over 200,000 hours of prison time for the wrongly incarcerated and has cut time spent awaiting trial by 50%.

Ahmed co-founded SMART Liberia in 2011, as a result of his experience as a high school graduate looking for mentorship opportunities and resources to access higher education. SMART Liberia's work is focused on three strategic areas: the Education Advancement Project, a university preparatory programme for high school graduates; the Youth Entrepreneurship Programme, an incubation service for young Liberian entrepreneurs; and the Professional Development Programme, designed to facilitate the entry of university graduates into the professional world.

Hope Behind Bars Africa



Oluwafunke created Hope Behind Bars in 2018, as a female-led social impact organisation addressing inequalities in Nigeria's criminal justice system. Originally inspired by wrongful accusations against her father, Oluwafunke began offering pro-bono services to prisoners and shared her story online, which led to people offering to volunteer and her starting Hope Behind Bars Africa. The organisation's scope now goes beyond free legal services and is attempting to reform the criminal justice system in the country.

Katarina Bošković - Montenegro 🏴

Katarina is the Founder and President of the European Association for Law and Finance (EALF), an organisation that brings together young people, civil leaders, war victims, and peace experts to reflect on the aftermath of conflict and rebuild communities in the Balkans through respect and trust. Their work prioritises groups that are traditionally underrepresented in peacebuilding discourses, including victims of war who are also victims of sexual assault.

Katarina attended the One Young World Summit in Munich, 2021, and spoke on a panel with fellow European Commission Peace Ambassadors on the challenges of being a peacebuilder. Following the Summit, she contributed to the "Declaration on the Future of Peacebuilding and Leadership" and participated in One Young World's Action Accelerator programme, as a result of which she developed her peacebuilding apps. Katarina will participate in the UN General Assembly in 2023, on account of learning about the participation opportunities from fellow Ambassador Ramiz Bakhtiar.

The European Association for Law and Finance has impacted more than 20,000 young people and over 1,000 civil leaders, war victims and peace experts. Their education programme, Peace Talks, has reached 800 teachers from six countries in the western Balkans and provided them with resources and tools to both learn about peacebuilding and teach the topic in classrooms. Katarina and her team have also developed a pilot programme connecting victims of war with psychologists to help tackle post-traumatic stress disorder, impacting 40 people with plans to scale further. Their peace app, made for students, has over 20,000 users and offers eight hours of regularly updated interactive content on peace and conflict resolution, including live lectures. In 2023, they want to expand their policy and legal frameworks project, through which they produced a recommendation that was implemented in June 2022 by the government of Bosnia and Herzegovina to give state benefits to war victims.

Ramiz's childhood was significantly impacted by the conflict in Afghanistan, and these experiences led him to discover constructive ways to resolve conflicts peacefully. During a visit to the United Nations in 2018, he met his co-founder, Lika Torikashvili, with whom he founded Peace in Our Schools as an interfaith initiative teaching young people about peacebuilding. Ramiz is an Afghan Muslim, and Lika is a Georgian Jew; they lead Peace in Our Schools, a non-profit organisation together to build a more peaceful, just and inclusive world.

Ramiz attended the One Young World Summit in Munich, 2021, which gave him an opportunity to connect with other young leaders in peacebuilding and speak on a panel about his work. The Summit gave Ramiz access to a network of contacts that have since helped promote and develop his work. One Young World Ambassadors have also participated in Peace in Our Schools' Youth Diplomacy Talks, in which community leaders and experts from different faiths discuss peacebuilding, bringing a uniquely diverse perspective to the programme.

Peace in Our School's Peace Camps last for three days with approximately 20 participants in each camp ranging from school children to young adults. The Peace Camps, which have been held in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, and Indonesia, centre on skills-building, conflict resolution, emotional intelligence, and involve direct support from certified psychologists. Over 600 students from 10 schools have engaged with the programme so far, while 12 online Youth Diplomacy Talks have reached over 2,500 people through direct participants and livestreams. For their work with Peace in Our Schools, Ramiz and Lika received a PACEY award from the Basel Peace Office in 2023. Following this, Peace in Our Schools plans on working with Ukrainian refugees and Russian immigrants through its Peace Camps in Georgia.

Leadership involves mobilising people to work towards a common goal.Without a network of supporters and the necessary tools to connect with these individuals, it can be challenging to effectively exercise leadership. My experience at the Summit proved to be invaluable, as it provided me with a network of collaborators and young leaders who have supported and facilitated my journey in exercising effective leadership."

Rez co-founded Refugees Seeking Equal Access at the Table (R-SEAT) formally in 2021, after six years of working for more meaningful inclusion of refugees in international and domestic policy-making conversations that affect them. Empower, her first initiative, has reached around 20,000 refugees, through mentoring programmes and workshops. Rez led the first ever Global Refugee Youth Consultations in 2016 and helped form the Global Youth Advisory Council to the UNHCR. She also co-founded the Centre for Asia Pacific Refugee Studies at the University of Auckland, a research centre focused on informing and developing responses to conflict and climate-induced displacement throughout the region.

Rez attended the One Young World Summit in Munich, 2021, as a One Young World Peace Ambassador and Delegate Speaker. The exposure to fellow Ambassadors and their work globally inspired her, and presented her with multiple potential opportunities for future collaboration. Rez was also invited to speak on peacebuilding and conflict resolution during the One Young World Peace Events in 2021 and 2023 respectively.

R-SEAT has been instrumental in developing mechanisms for refugee representation in four countries. These mechanisms are composed of a group of refugees that act as community representatives and liaisons with their respective national governments in the United States, Ireland, New Zealand, and Canada. The initiative is also in the process of establishing mechanisms in Colombia, Mexico, Germany, Uganda, Portugal, Switzerland, and Kenya. In addition to representing refugee communities, the members of the mechanisms advise governments and have actively facilitated changes in national policy, such as New Zealand's refugee resettlement strategy. The US mechanism is also cooperating extensively with the US State Department on funding for organisations operating within the international refugee regime. Through R-SEAT, refugees have chaired forums in the UNHCR for the first time.

⁶⁶ The most valuable impact of becoming part of the One Young World Community is the exposure to what other young people are doing around the world, and the connections and ideas that come out of it. From 2020 - 2022, the average SROI of One Young World's featured Ambassador-led projects was 1:16.

This means that for every \$1 invested in them, featured Ambassador-led projects have produced \$16 of social value.

The average SROI from the five projects led by Peace Ambassadors in 2022 is an extremely impressive


