Pre-Summit Global Leadership Programme

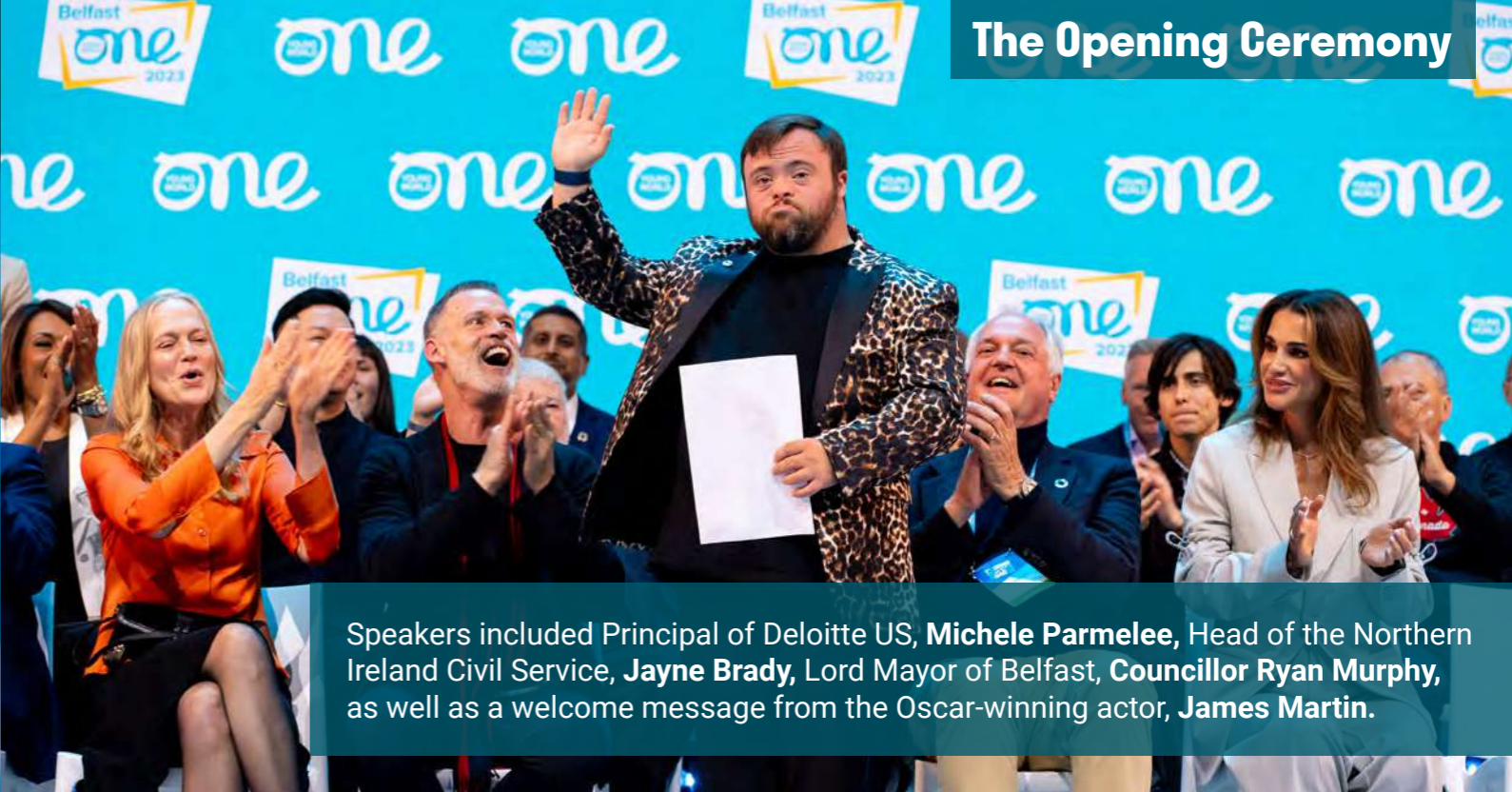

Good Friday Agreement - 25 Years of Peace Delivered

Recognising the historic significance of the Summit in marking the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement, we hosted a series of discussions reflecting on the Troubles and the Good Friday Agreement as well as looking forward to the future of Northern Ireland.

The session closed with a keynote address from Former President of Colombia and Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, President Juan Manuel Santos on providing a blueprint for creating the conditions, and delivering, a lasting peace agreement.

Journalist of the Year Award

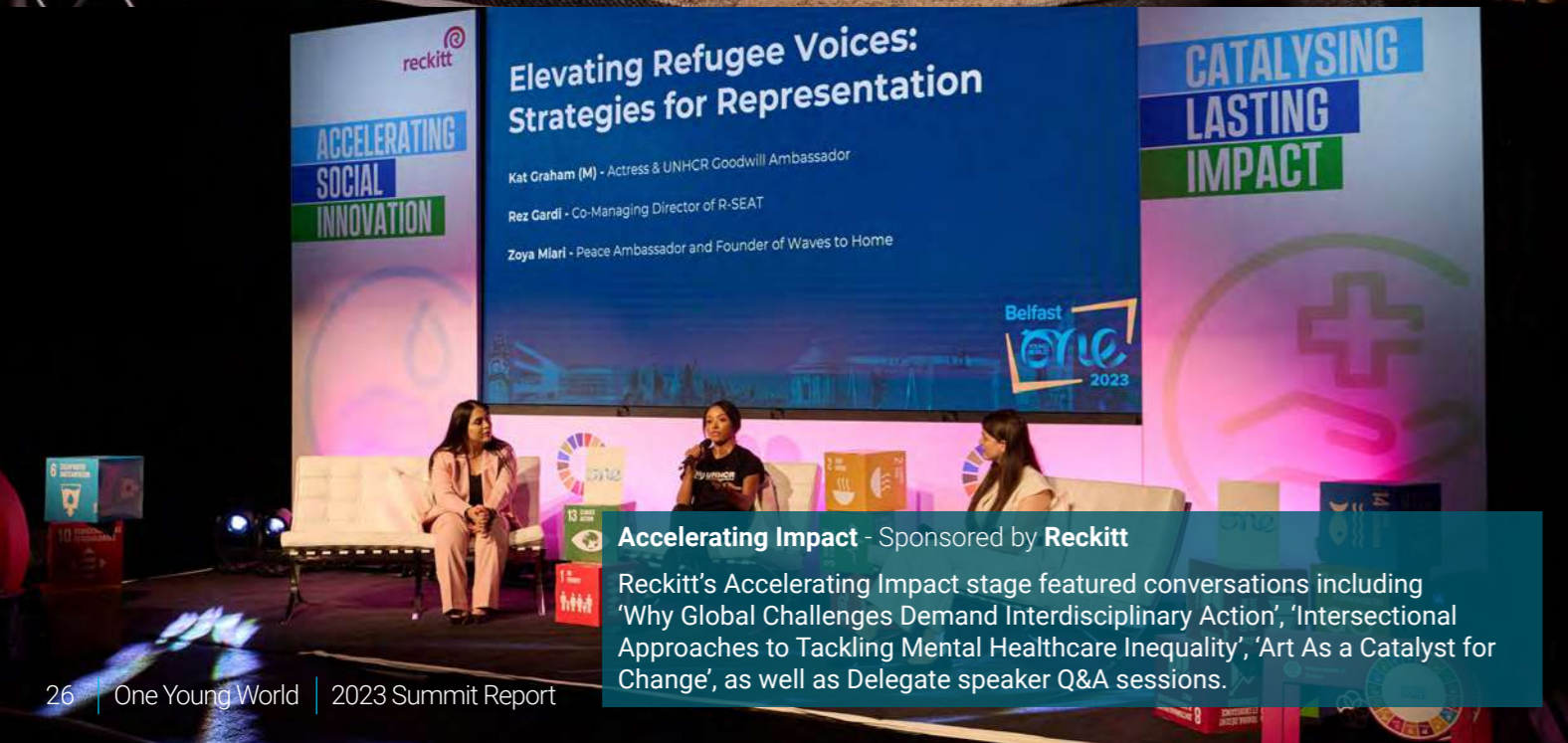

During the One Young World Summit, Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and Enes Kanter Freedom, participated in local community events in Belfast. This was to ensure that the One Young World Summit would leave a legacy in Belfast and to guarantee that young people in Belfast would have a lasting impact from our time in the City.

Former NBA Basketball star Enes Kanter Freedom visited Queen's University Belfast to host one of his Basketball Camps for local children from the area. Enes held a two-hour coaching session where he taught basketball skills and held a game for everyone to participate in. He also made time to talk to the children about his story and why he was in Belfast attending the One Young World Summit and had pictures with everyone.

Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah visited the Conway Education Centre in Belfast, to meet a group of asylum seekers, refugees, and members of the local community to learn about the experiences of displaced people in Northern Ireland and to see the work that the City of Belfast are doing to provide opportunities for the Refugee community in Northern Ireland.

Open to all, these **26** issue-focussed networking sessions offered Delegates the chance to connect, exchange ideas, and form impactful collaborations on a wide range of sustainability challenges.

Hosted by experts from the One Young World Community, these guided discussions were designed to inspire and facilitate collaborative social impact solutions on topics including:

Juliet Namujju - Uganda

Juliet Namujju is the founder and CEO of Kimuli Collections, a sustainable fashion label in Uganda which combats environmental pollution by making clothes from waste materials. Kimuli Collections is working to transform the plastic waste crisis in Africa through the creation of an eco fashion label that pioneers upcycling discarded plastic waste materials.

Juliet grew up in poverty as an orphan with her grandmother, who was a tailor, and was inspired to use cut-offs and plastic waste to produce her own dolls. She obtained a certificate in fashion and design at the age of 20 and later joined the Social Innovation Academy (SINA), which empowers marginalised young people to become social entrepreneurs. With the help of SINA, she founded Kimuli Collections, which currently employs 25 individuals full-time, and upcycles over 50,000 kilograms of plastic waste into 20,000 garments and accessories every year.

As well as this, Kimuli Collections promotes the inclusion of those with disabilities by creating employment opportunities for disabled tailors. Juliet has presented her up-cycled fashion in Germany at the Bildkorrekturren fashion conference in 2017, she won the Ugandan Ye-Community Award 2018, became a TEEP Fellow, being awarded by Ban-Ki-Moon as the “Global Greenpreneur” award winner in Seoul Korea and was a winner of the 2023 “Best Young Employer of the Year” in Uganda.

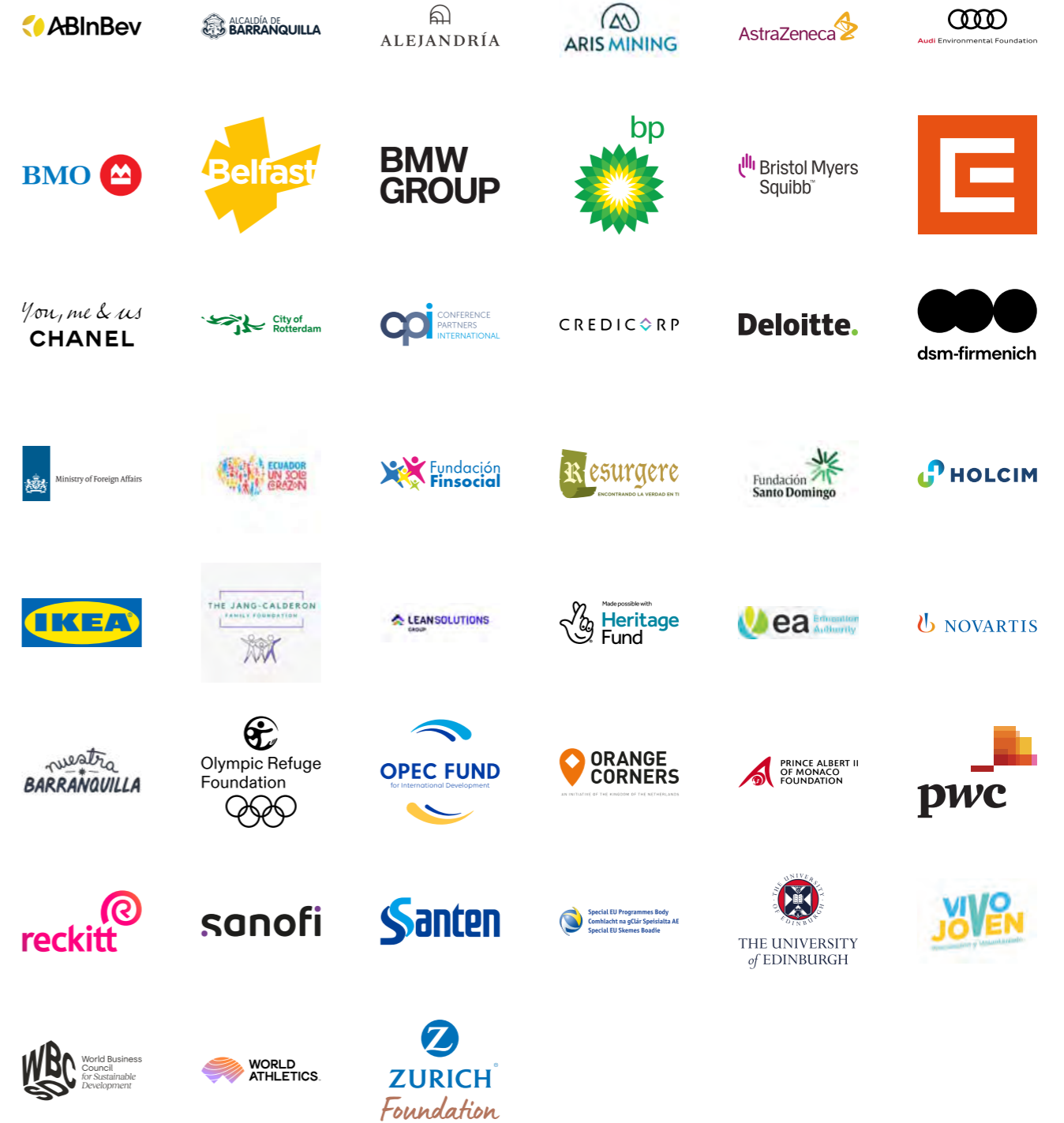
Alice Hendy lost her brother Josh to suicide at 21 years old after he had been researching techniques to take his own life via harmful internet searches. From working in the cybersecurity sector for over a decade, Alice decided to use her skillset to create R;pple Suicide Prevention Charity to prevent others from following this path.

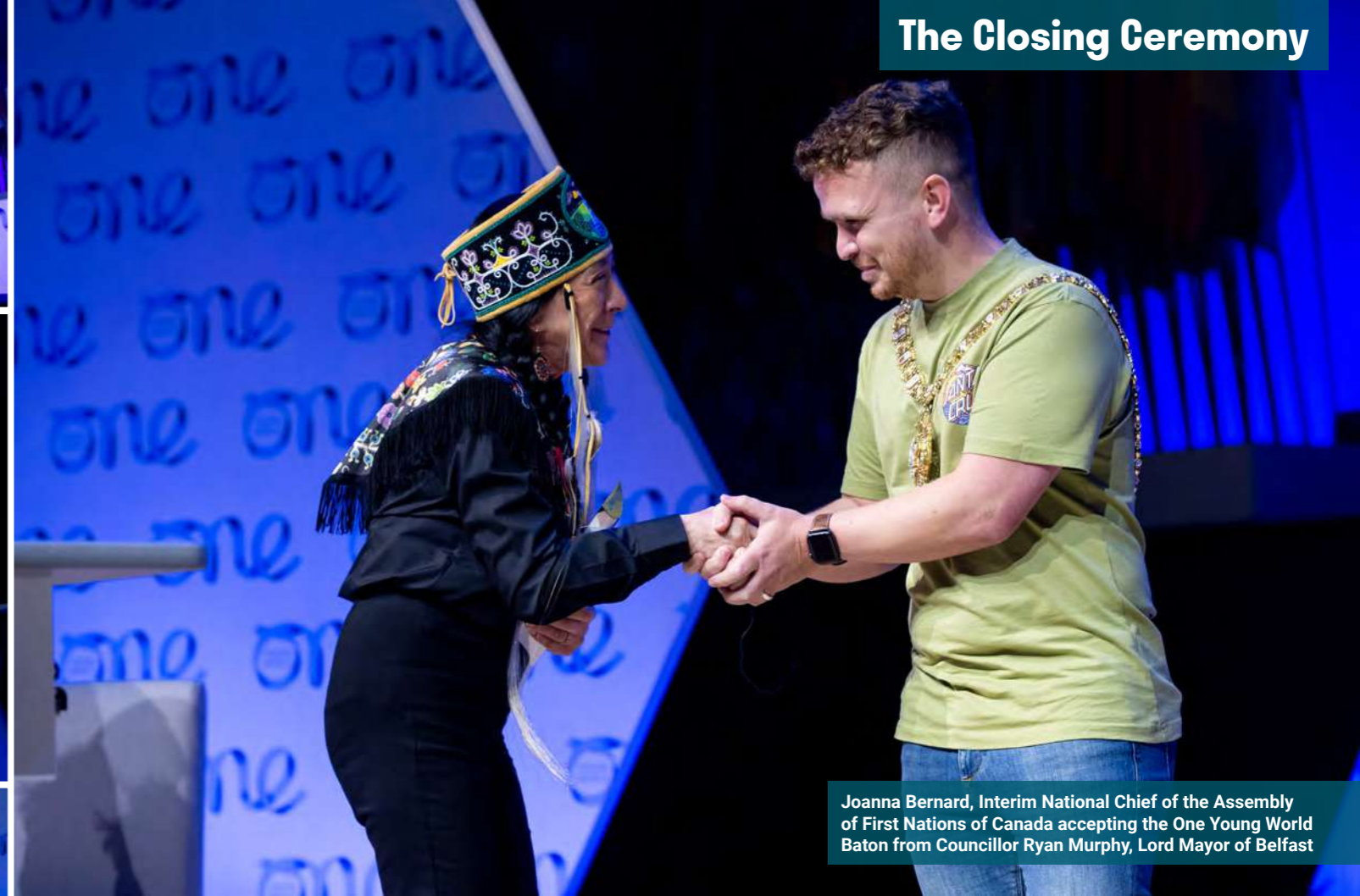
R;pple is an online tool and crisis intervention browser extension that can be downloaded on computers and laptops worldwide, and can be deployed on wifi networks. It is available in 48 countries and in 13 languages. Once downloaded if someone goes online and conducts a harmful search relating to the topic of suicide/self-harm, R;pple intervenes and interrupts that search.

They will be guided through a filter of breathing exercises and then very simple, uncluttered and calmly presented strategies and forums, help lines and mental health services they can access both now and longer term: accompanied with messages of hope and encouragement to keep safe.

To date, R;pple has been downloaded 1.8 million times, intercepted over 20,000 harmful online searches, and saved 26 lives. R;pple is spelt this way as the semicolon is the international sign for surviving suicide, and is used to symbolise that the the story isn't over.

The Summit concluded with our Closing Ceremony at the main auditorium at the ICC Belfast. The Closing Ceremony featured incredible performances from one of our indigenous Delegates, Rosalie LaBillois, co-chair of the National Youth Council of the Assembly of First Nations, Canada, and Rupi Kaur, poet, artist and activist.

We presented funds to the 10 Lead2030 challenge winners, and heard from Moira Doherty, Deputy Secretary of the Department for the Economy NI, and Councillor Ryan Murphy, Lord Mayor of Belfast, who passed our One Young World baton onto Montreal. Representing the Canadian government were Joanna Bernard, Interim National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations of Canada, and Arielle Kayabaga, Members of Parliament, House of Commons of Canada.

The next One Young World Summit will take place in Montréal, Canada, in 2024 - a city that offers a diverse and inspiring environment for young leaders to connect, learn, and collaborate.

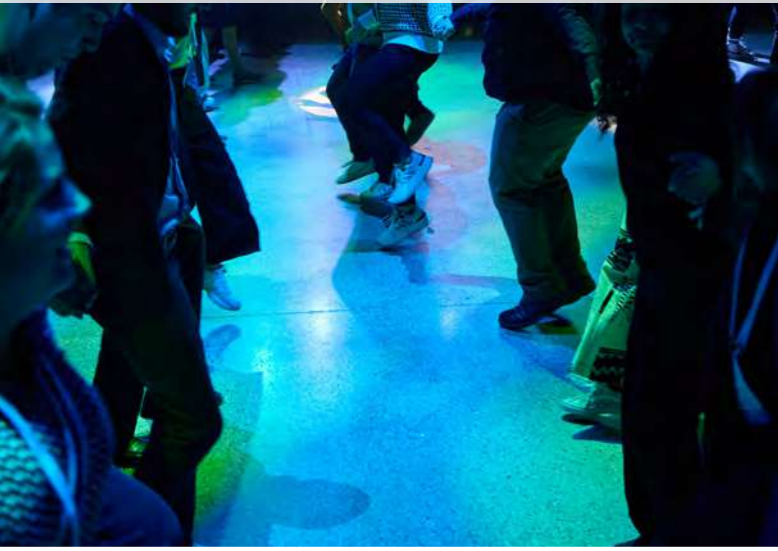
One Young World will organise an Indigenous Youth Day before the Summit in Montréal in 2024. This event will bring together young Indigenous and First Nation leaders worldwide to share their experiences, learn from each other, and engage with other One Young World Delegates.

Delegates will be hosted in the iconic Bell Centre, the largest ice hockey arena in the world and the home of the Montréal Canadiens of the National Hockey League and the Palais des Congrès de Montréal.



Delegates were hosted at different dinner locations on each Summit night. On night two, Delegates attended three Cathedral Quarter Dine Arouns and on night three, Delegates attended 11 Community Dine Arouns at various iconic venues across Belfast.

These dinners allowed Delegates time to network, relax and experience Belfast's giant welcome. Over 5,000 meals were served, and all dietary requirements were catered for.

In order to make the Summit as accessible as possible, One Young World implemented the following procedures at the Belfast Summit. Our aim is to make the Summit accessible to all and help to make the Delegates' journey as smooth as possible between all our venues and throughout the duration of the Summit.

- All One Young World Belfast venues and stages were fully accessible.
- International sign language took place at the Opening Ceremony and on the Presentation stage.
- Closed caption text was available on the Presentation stage and Interactive Stages.
- Height adjustable lecterns on the Presentation stage.
- A Quiet room, male and female prayer rooms and a family feeding room were available at the ICC.
- Non-alcoholic and quiet spaces were available at the evening dinners.
- A Buddy scheme was provided where requested.
- Personalised accessible transport schedules were provided where requested.



Sustainability is a top priority at One Young World and is a core part of our operations. We are committed to playing our part in delivering on the Paris Agreement as rapidly as possible and uphold our ISO20121 Sustainable Events certification.

Here are some of the steps that were taken this year:

- The ICC was within walking distance of the majority of other Summit venues and hotels around Belfast.
- Where car journeys were unavoidable, hybrid/ electric vehicles and public transport were recommended.
- Badges and lanyards were made from paper and sustainable cotton.
- In the main exhibition, the container stands were manufactured from re-board, a recycled material. Additional hanging artwork was manufactured from PVC Free Banner. Any furniture was rented and natural products such as plants were incorporated into the booth designs.
- All bins at the ICC were multi-purpose and took recycling, which was then processed and sorted by the venue.
- All catering was locally sourced and provided in biodegradable containers with wooden cutlery. Where any food was surplus, this was given to local food banks.
- Pepsi provided cans only alongside recycling life cycle banners by each fridge. All cans were taken away post-event to be recycled.
- Reusable drink bottles were supplied by Pernod Ricard to use at water and refreshment refill stations. Delegates were recommended to bring their own drink bottles and hot beverage cups.
- The One Young World merchandise store clothing is zero waste, made from certified organic cotton and printed in a renewable energy-powered factory.
- All the Summit venues had sustainability policies which met our strict requirements. All our suppliers were asked to sign the One Young World Sustainability pledge and if this is not met would be removed from the site.
- Delegates were given the opportunity to email the dedicated sustainability inbox if they spot anything they would like to change or have any ideas to make the Summit even more Sustainable.
