




Yasmina Benslimane

The Global Leadership Programme: What's Next?

Session 3: Circular Economy and Responsible Tech

Summary:

The third session in our Global Leadership will explore two of our 2025 Plenary Challenges, Circular Economy and Responsible Technology, and how the topics intersect. Through a mixture of informative presentations and interactive exercises, attendees will learn more about sustainability solutions and challenges occurring due to the rapid proliferation of new technologies such as Artificial Intelligence.

Delegates will hear from a prestigious One Young World Counsellor expert in the topic, and be joined live by outstanding young leaders working in the area who will share actionable lessons to create impact.

Empowering Women & Girls Through Leadership

Founded by mental health advocate and One Young World Ambassador Hauwa Ojeifo, the Impact Fund is on a mission to improve systems of care for the health and wellbeing of **100 million women and girls by 2030**. This scholarship supports exceptional young leaders (aged 18-30) working to advance:

Ensuring Global Representation

The **Leading Scholarship** is One Young World's flagship initiative to ensure that outstanding young leaders from under-represented countries have a seat at the global table.

Designed to spotlight voices that are often missing from international forums, this scholarship guarantees that the Summit reflects the full diversity of global youth leadership.

Visa information



While One Young World provides a detailed visa guide to all Summit attendees after they complete registration, we wanted to share this essential primer with partners to explain the process in more detail.

Who will need a visa to travel to the Summit?

Nationals of 93 countries can travel to Germany to attend the Summit without a visa. A full list of which nationalities require visas and which do not can be found here.

What visa will Delegates from visa required countries need to apply for?

Delegates with passports from visa required countries will need to apply for a Short-stay Schengen visa also known as a Schengen Visa Type C.

When can my Delegates apply for a visa?

In most cases Delegates can apply six months before their travel. For most people this date was 2 May 2025.

What is the application process?

After completing registration for the Summit, all Delegates will receive a detailed guide from One Young World on the application process. An overview of the process is as follows:

- 1. Complete a short stay Schengen visa application form.
- 2. Book a visa application appointment.
- 3. Prepare supporting documents.
- 4. Attend the visa application appointment.
- 5. Pay the application fee (€90)
- 6. Collect passport with visa from visa application centre.

What is the processing time?

After attending a visa application appointment, the standard processing time in most countries is 15 working days. There are, however, additional steps which add to the overall application process, such as the time it takes to prepare an application, the availability of application appointments, and the time it takes for stamped passports to be returned. We strongly advise that Delegates begin the application process as soon as they have registered for the Summit.

What support will One Young World provide?

One Young World will provide all Delegates requiring visas with two letters of invitation, one issued by One Young World and one from the City of Munich.

How can I best support my Delegates?

- Encourage Delegates to complete their Summit registration as soon as they have been selected. One Young World can't issue visa guidance or letters of invitation to Delegates until they complete registration.
- Provide a letter of invitation from your company confirming that the Delegate is an employee, that they have been selected to represent the company at the One Young World Summit and that the company is bearing the costs of their visit. A template of this letter can be found here.
- If using an external supplier, such as a travel agent to assist with visa applications, ensure One Young World's full visa guidance is shared with the agent.

Will Delegates need an ETIAS?

ETIAS is an electronic travel authorisation and an entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals travelling to Germany and 29 other European countries. ETIAS will start operations until the last quarter of 2026 so will not be required for One Young World Delegates.
