Aziz Abu Sarah and Maoz Inon

At One Young World, we believe true change begins with the courage to confront sensitive issues and engage in conversations that matter. In light of this, we are honoured to be welcoming Palestinian peacebuilder Aziz Abu Sarah and Israeli peace entrepreneur, Maoz Inon to the 2025 Summit in Munich.

Aziz lost his brother during the first Intifada, and Maoz lost both his parents on October 7. Despite their immense grief, they have chosen to work tirelessly to build bridges between Palestinians and Israelis, and model a future grounded in reconciliation and peace. As friends, social entrepreneurs, and co-authors, they embody the transformative power of dialogue and shared humanity. Their story is not only one of loss, but of hope, courage, and the belief that even amidst violent cruelty and tragic conflict, peace is possible.

Janet Aguti

Janet Aguti is a Ugandan activist and founder of Totya Platform, dedicated to fighting against sexual violence. A survivor herself and a mother, she empowers victims through medical, psychosocial, and legal support while advocating for policy reforms, law enforcement accountability, and cultural shifts to end impunity and stigma.

Foday Kamara

Foday David Kamara is a Sierra Leonean social entrepreneur and environmental champion. He is the founder of Ecovironment, a systems-driven enterprise transforming plastic waste into sustainable construction materials, creating green jobs and advancing climate resilience across Sierra Leone. Foday is reshaping how Africa tackles pollution, poverty and sustainability.

Dr Dumazedier Kabasele

Dr. Dumazedier Kabasele is a prominent figure in infectious disease prevention and public health strategy in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), with over a decade of experience in research and health programme implementation. 

Global Leadership Programme

We are well underway with our Global Leadership Programme, having successfully hosted four of our six Sessions.

Here is a quick summary of the sessions so far:

Delegates were introduced to the Global Leadership Charter, a shared framework for responsible and effective leadership, created in collaboration with the One Young World Community.

Throughout all sessions, multiple aspects of the Summit have been incorporated, ensuring Delegates learn about the Summit before they head to Munich this November. We covered this year's five key Plenary Challenges, hosted a workshop-style session, and presented Ambassador Spotlights as examples of speaking opportunities similar to delegate speeches.

We've been honoured to hear from our co-founder, Kate Robertson, who welcomed Delegates and spoke on One Young World's mission to identify, connect, and promote young leaders around the world

Matcha Phorn-In challenged us to stand up for justice for marginalised communities and combat hate and discrimination.



Kahsennenhawe Sky-Deer, former Grand Chief, introduced the core indigenous values behind the Circular Economy.

We have two Sessions taking place, to round off our Programme:

- Session 5: Connect with your Region | 17 25 September, Regent Dependent Breakout style Sessions, led by our Global Volunteer Team. This is the chance for Delegates to connect with other Delegates from their region, to network, and build those connections!
- Session 6: Wilkommen in München | 16 October

Hosted by the City of Munich, Delegates will have the opportunity to learn from locals about Munich's history and culture, and will leave the session with tips on how to make the most of their Summit experience in Munich!

Workshop Registration



Workshops are a vital element of every One Young World Summit. Facilitated by partner organisations and individuals, workshops allow Delegates to delve into crucial topics in smaller groups.

We encourage facilitators to use diverse delivery methods, including dynamic problem solving, group discussions, scenario-based challenges and personal experiences to share their content in an engaging and educational format.

Workshops reflect on a combination of the Summit plenary challenges, UN Sustainable Development Goals and regional initiatives.

Workshop Facilitator applications are now closed, with successful applicants to be informed in the coming weeks.

Delegates will receive a list of workshops available, FAQs and information on when registration opens for their region on 8 October 2025.

Delegate Workshop Registration opens on 8 October 2025 and closes 14 October 2025 Delegates can register via the Community Platform.

Visa information



While One Young World provides a detailed visa guide to all Summit attendees after they complete registration, we wanted to share this essential primer with partners to explain the process in more detail.

Who will need a visa to travel to the Summit?

Nationals of 93 countries can travel to Germany to attend the Summit without a visa. A full list of which nationalities require visas and which do not can be found here.

What visa will Delegates from visa required countries need to apply for?

Delegates with passports from visa required countries will need to apply for a Short-stay Schengen visa also known as a Schengen Visa Type C.

When can my Delegates apply for a visa?

In most cases Delegates can apply six months before their travel. For most people this date was 2 May 2025.

What is the application process?

After completing registration for the Summit, all Delegates will receive a detailed guide from One Young World on the application process. An overview of the process is as follows:

- 1. Complete a short stay Schengen visa application form.
- 2. Book a visa application appointment.
- 3. Prepare supporting documents.
- 4. Attend the visa application appointment.
- 5. Pay the application fee (€90)
- 6. Collect passport with visa from visa application centre.

What is the processing time?

After attending a visa application appointment, the standard processing time in most countries is 15 working days. There are, however, additional steps which add to the overall application process, such as the time it takes to prepare an application, the availability of application appointments, and the time it takes for stamped passports to be returned. We strongly advise that Delegates begin the application process as soon as they have registered for the Summit.

What support will One Young World provide?

One Young World will provide all Delegates requiring visas with two letters of invitation, one issued by One Young World and one from the City of Munich.

How can I best support my Delegates?

- Encourage Delegates to complete their Summit registration as soon as they have been selected. One Young World can't issue visa guidance or letters of invitation to Delegates until they complete registration.
- Provide a letter of invitation from your company confirming that the Delegate is an employee, that they have been selected to represent the company at the One Young World Summit and that the company is bearing the costs of their visit. A template of this letter can be found here.
- If using an external supplier, such as a travel agent to assist with visa applications, ensure One Young World's full visa guidance is shared with the agent.

Will Delegates need an ETIAS?

ETIAS is an electronic travel authorisation and an entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals travelling to Germany and 29 other European countries. ETIAS will start operations until the last quarter of 2026 so will not be required for One Young World Delegates.
