To ensure this, fully-funded scholarships are awarded to outstanding young leaders with a range of backgrounds, skill sets and nationalities.

The One Young World Summit is a transformational experience for scholars; accelerating their leadership development, and providing them with an unparalleled international network of potential collaborators. These scholarships - alongside Lead2030 and Leadership Awards - are delivered in partnership with global corporations, governments, and civil society. In addition to bringing employees to the Summit, companies will integrate external scholars into the Summit as part of their internal Delegations.

Scholar Case Studies

Adelin Jacques de Dixmude, Belgium
Supported by the Pernod Ricard Scholarship



Adelin is the Co-Founder and CEO of Fline, a social enterprise that emerged from a deeply personal tragedy: the loss of his grandmother in a car accident caused by a drunk driver. Together with his brother Maxence and their friend Zachary, he chose to transform this painful experience into meaningful action. This led to the creation of Fline and its flagship innovation, the FlineBox, the first interactive breathalyser specifically designed for nightlife environments.

Fline’s mission is both clear and ambitious: to make drink-driving prevention accessible, visible, and engaging by working directly within the spaces where risks occur, such as bars, clubs, events and festivals. Since 2024, over one million tests have been conducted using FlineBoxes. The devices are now deployed in more than eight European countries, through partnerships with governments, leading festivals and multinational companies.



Ornella Hasimbola Dechen, Madagascar
Supported by the Z Zurich Foundation Scholarship



Ornella is a dedicated mental health counsellor, advocate and the Founder of “Water Yourself”, an organisation committed to addressing the mental health crisis in Madagascar and across Africa. Since 2021, Water Yourself has impacted over 2,000 individuals, providing mental health services, education, and support to young people in schools and universities, marginalised communities, people victims of environmental disasters and displacement, as well as businesses and NGOs who want to make mental health a priority.

Under Ornella’s leadership, the organisation has also established mental health hubs in schools, trained teachers, peer educators and students to become mental health advocates. She is passionate about empowering young people to become agents of change in mental health advocacy, giving access to affordable and quality care, helping to break the stigma and build a more resilient future for Africa.

Her work has made significant contributions to the mental health sector, fostering innovation and sustainable progress across the continent. Ornella continues to lead efforts in promoting mental health as a priority, ensuring that African youth play a central role in driving solutions and shaping a sustainable future of mental health on the continent

Hugo Noé Flores, Honduras
Supported by the Ilia Calderón Scholarship



Hugo is a Honduran civil engineer and a prominent youth leader committed to building a more just, equitable, and inclusive country. Deeply connected to his Lenca Indigenous roots, he has led impactful youth-led initiatives focused on civic engagement, leadership development, and gender-based violence prevention in western Honduras. He served as President of the Lenca Youth Movement, where he coordinated community efforts to strengthen youth leadership, promote entrepreneurship, and advocate for public policies in favor of young people. Under his leadership, formal agreements were signed with local governments to support youth development initiatives.

Currently, Hugo serves as the Regional Coordinator of the Revolutionary Youth Movement of Honduras (MOJUREH), where he supports and strengthens youth networks across Intibucá, Lempira, and Copán. He also leads the Raíces Juveniles (Youth Roots) project, which focuses on eradicating gender-based violence through participatory strategies involving children, adolescents, and youth, in partnership with community organisations and local authorities.

Scholarship Partner Spotlights



Z Zurich Foundation

In 2025, the Z Zurich Foundation supported 42 scholars leading grassroots initiatives across their three pillars: improving mental wellbeing, enabling social equity, and adapting to climate change. These young leaders were recruited worldwide and from the Z Zurich Foundation's network of charity partners, and attended the Summit as integrated members of the Z Zurich Foundation's wider Delegation.

Scholars participated in a tailor-made pre-Summit programming, including a series of virtual sessions with the Delegation, and a full pre-Summit connection day of activities.



The Z Zurich Foundation also sponsored a dinner for over 200 scholars, which offered them the opportunity to engage with each other before the Summit in an informal and meaningful way. In addition, the Z Zurich Foundation secured an exhibition booth and donated the use of the booth to EqualReach, a charity partner and platform connecting displaced talent with meaningful work globally - founded by Giselle Gonzales, a 2024 Scholar.



AstraZeneca's Young Health Programme

One Young World has proudly partnered with AstraZeneca's Young Health Programme (YHP) since 2016 to empower young leaders who are innovating, advocating, or educating for health equity in their communities.

In 2025, AstraZeneca's YHP supported 13 Young Health Programme Fellows who are advocating for health equity, particularly in the field of rare disease and non-communicable disease (NCD) prevention.



Selected Fellows received fully-funded access to the Summit as part of AstraZeneca's wider Delegation, alongside a USD \$10,000 grant to implement a project through their non-profit organisation. An additional two young leaders were selected as Lead2030 Challenge winners, and received a USD \$50,000 grant to accelerate their impact. Additionally, AstraZeneca sponsored 100 employees to attend the Summit as Delegates.

Ambassador Masterclasses

Exceptional young leaders in the One Young World Community were invited back to the Summit to share their experience and expertise throughout the agenda.

They provided inspiration and practical guidance to Delegates on how to transform the experience into action, and demonstrate a pathway to creating transformative impact as a One Young World Ambassador.

Pre-Summit Activity

Send-off events

Summit send-off events give Partners and Delegates the chance to meet their peers ahead of the Summit, prepare them for the Summit experience, and build Delegates excitement leading to the Summit.

These events enabled Delegates to connect with each other and potential collaborators in advance of the Summit as well as introduce Delegates to the Summit Plenary Challenges. The sessions provided Delegates with information and tips about the Summit to maximise their experience while exposing them to the benefits of the Community including creating a sense of regional community before the Summit.

Pre-Summit Global Leadership Programme

The Global Leadership Programme is designed to provide Delegates with enhanced and comprehensive leadership skills and principles, alongside expertise on the year's Plenary Challenges. Delegates also have the opportunity to find out what to expect from the Summit, how to prepare, and the chance to connect with their peers.

The 2025 Global Leadership Programme comprised a six-part digital series, which was held across six months leading up to the Summit. Sessions included presentations and discussions on this year's Plenary Challenges, an introduction to the One Young World team of Managing and Coordinating Ambassadors, and a welcome for our city hosts, the City of Munich.

Deloitte continued its long-standing collaboration with One Young World and sponsored the Opening Ceremony in Munich, a core element of their partnership since 2022.

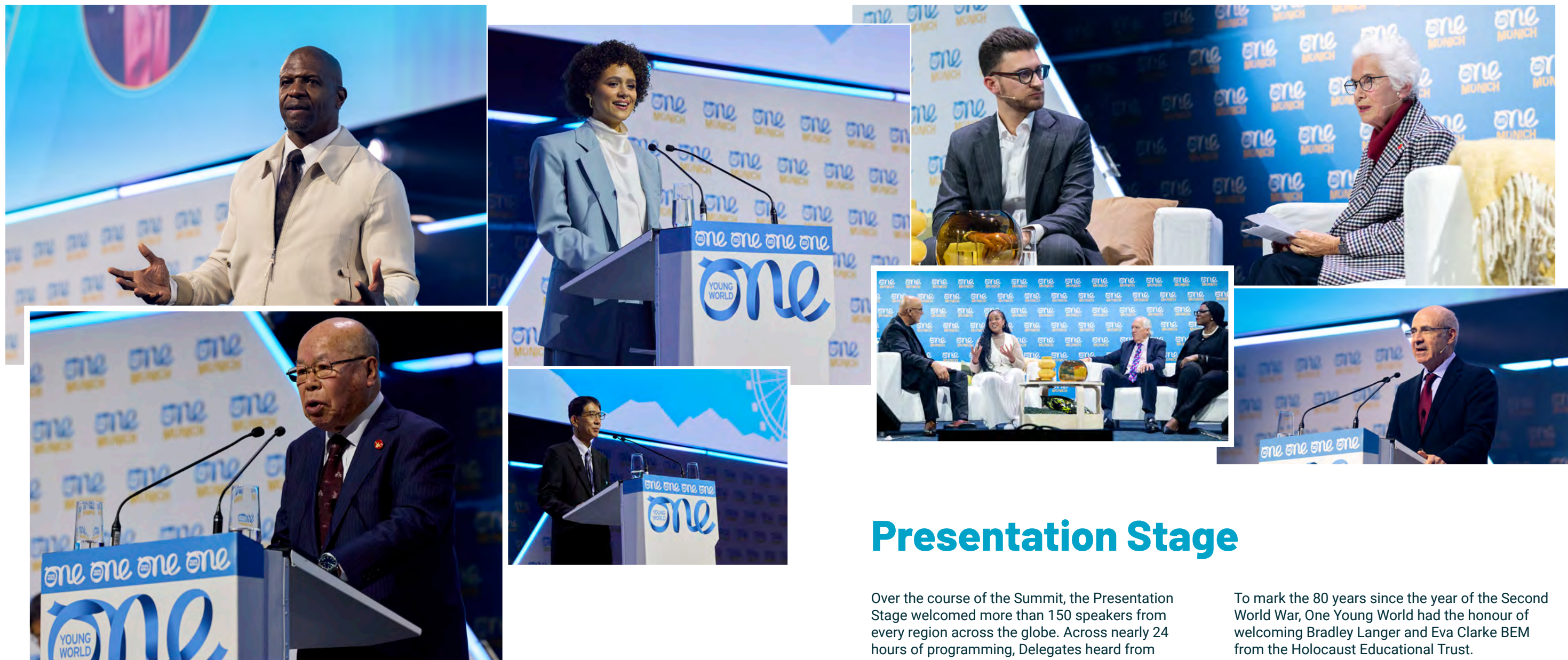

Presentation Stage

Over the course of the Summit, the Presentation Stage welcomed more than 150 speakers from every region across the globe. Across nearly 24 hours of programming, Delegates heard from some of the world’s most inspirational leaders, including eight Nobel Prize winning individuals and organisations, alongside prominent international CEOs, influential business leaders and distinguished voices from across the humanitarian sector.

Amongst endless highlights, we were honoured to open the Summit with an address from two-time Emmy Award Nominee and star of Game of Thrones, Fast & Furious, and Megalopolis, Nathalie Emmanuel.

We also welcomed Terry Crews, actor, human rights activist and presenter of America’s Got Talent, who shared his personal experience with toxic masculinity. Speaking on the importance of empathy, accountability, and respect as foundations for healthier relationships, Terry explored how true strength comes from authenticity rather than dominance.

To mark the 80 years since the year of the Second World War, One Young World had the honour of welcoming Bradley Langer and Eva Clarke BEM from the Holocaust Educational Trust.

In a moving interview led by Bradley, Eva recounted the extraordinary story of her parents, her own birth in Mauthausen concentration camp in Austria, and the journey that brought her and her mother to the UK.

We also had the privilege to hear from Toru Yamaguchi and Representative Commissioner Shigemitsu Tanaka from Nihon Hidankyo, 2024 Nobel Peace Prize Winner. As a survivor of the atomic bombing of Nagasaki, Representative Commissioner Tanaka reflected on the organisation’s mission and shared his own testimony, underscoring the urgent need for future generations to understand the human toll of nuclear weapons.

Plenary Challenges

The Plenary Challenge sessions on the Presentation Stage showcased our outstanding Delegate Speakers, all selected because of the power and scale of their impact. This year more than 300 Delegates applied to be a Delegate Speaker for just 25 spaces so the calibre was extremely high.

The topics covered in the Plenary Challenges were, the Circular Economy, Responsible Tech, Education, Peace and Security, and Anti-Hate. These topics were selected in consultation with the global One Young World Community.

Anti-Hate - What actions are needed to tackle hate in society?

For this session, three Delegate Speakers were selected through our internal speaker application process, and two Delegate Speakers were selected through the Break the Hate Challenge, presented by PACT!, which recognised outstanding young leaders who are tackling hate with bold ideas and creativity.



We first heard from three young leaders, **Leon Ford**, **Lavau Nalu**, and **Aden Carreon**, as to how they were tackling hate.

We then welcomed Andy Nulman and Stephen Bronfman from PACT! to hear from their competition winners, **Samuel Browne**, who performed a poem, and **Sophie Sandberg**, who performed a live art drawing using chalk. As well as the opportunity to perform live on the One Young World stage, both winners were awarded a £5,000 grant to accelerate their impact.

Lead2030 is a global initiative that supports young leaders and entrepreneurs working to achieve the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by providing them with the critical financial support and mentorship required to scale their solutions.

Newly launched Skills Hub

The Skills Hub was launched at our 2025 Summit in Munich. The SAP Skills Hub offered a platform for expert-led, 25-minute sessions designed to equip Delegates with practical, high-impact skills. Delivered in a TedTalk-style format, the sessions engaged attendees through silent-disco-style headsets, promoting focused participation in a busy and dynamic Summit environment.



Catalysing Impact Stage

The Catalysing Impact stage hosted a wide range of sessions, from Q&As and panel discussions to presentations and interactive keynotes.

The stage featured diverse conversations, including a panel of global people leaders examining the evolving talent landscape, a discussion on Indigenous voices in international spaces, and an exploration of the role of interfaith dialogue in peacebuilding and reconciliation within conflict-affected communities.

Networking Sessions

Networking sessions are designed to enable Delegates, Counsellors and Returning Ambassadors to meet members of their regional representatives on the Global Volunteer Team, interact with each other, share experiences and build relationships during the Summit. The aim is to inspire regional or sectoral cohesion which will drive continued interactions and partnerships post-Summit for Delegates.

The networking sessions were open to all Delegates, returning Ambassadors, and Partner Executives from the regions/sectors or who have interests in them. In total, there were seven regional and three sectoral networking sessions

The Community Square

The Community Square was an open plan exhibition area located in the foyer, right at the heart of the Summit venue, allowing Delegates to openly roam and network.

Summit catering was provided in the Community Square, allowing Delegates to make connections and engage in meaningful conversations over lunch and coffees.

One Young World Partners were offered the ability to showcase their brand initiatives and engage with Delegates on their booths. Pernod Ricard and their Drink More Water campaign offered Delegates refillable drink bottles and a water refill station.



Workshops

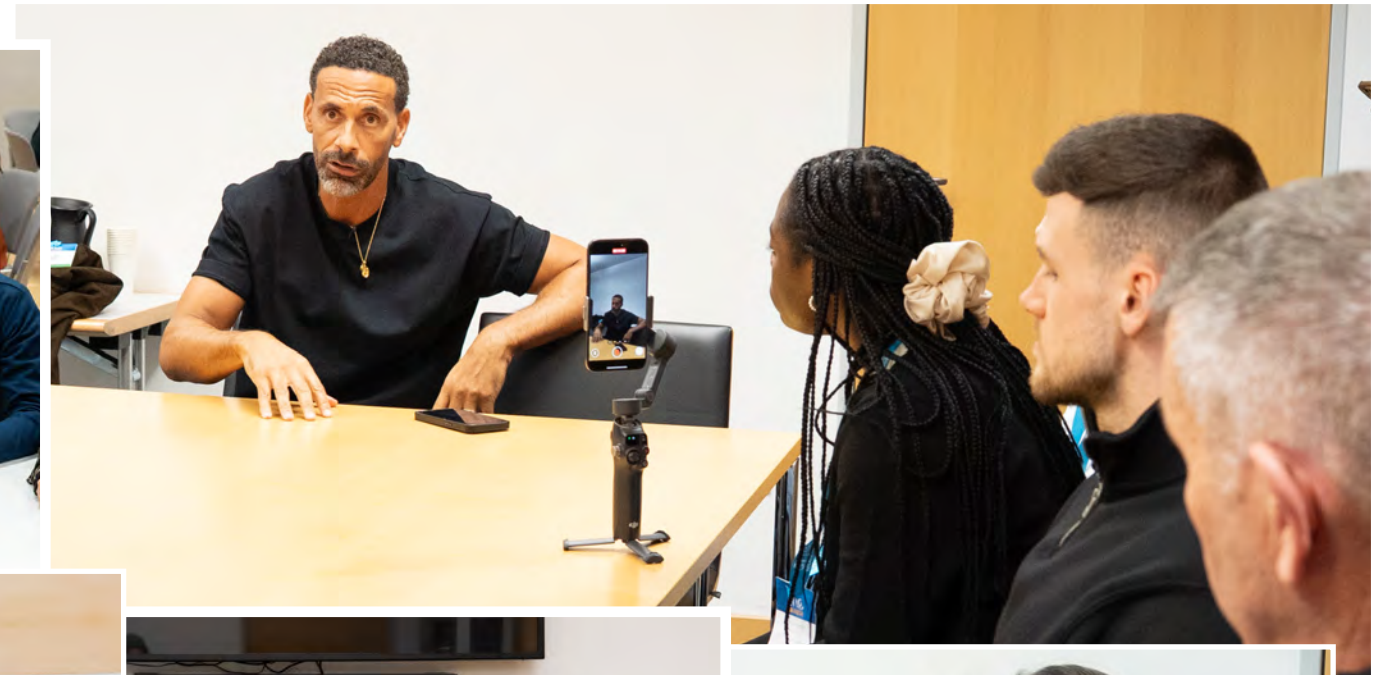
Hosted by our fantastic partner organisations, Returning Ambassadors as well as company leaders from across the world, workshops were intimate spaces centred around this year’s Plenary Challenges, the UN Sustainable Development Goals and specific regional initiatives designed to encourage discourse, pragmatism and post-Summit connections.

Delegates worked creatively and collaboratively in these sessions to come up with questions for the future and answers for today. Whether that was group activities, exploring machinery and equipment at the forefront of relevant fields, or ideological debates on theory, there was a broad spectrum of engagement tailored to every need.

From 40 workshops in total, highlights included our Managing and Coordinating Ambassador workshop on ‘The Power of Vulnerability in Global Leadership’, Deloitte’s session focusing on ‘Building Ethical AI: How Deloitte Is Future Proofing Technology’ and One Young World’s timely session facilitated by John Sealey ‘Why Is Men’s Mental Health Everyone’s Business?’, which welcomed Terry Crews as a special guest.

Action Circles

Action Circles invite Delegates to explore and develop collaborations with other young leaders working in the same area or tackling similar challenges. These sessions give Delegates the space to connect, share experiences, and exchange knowledge.

They start with a keynote introduction from an expert in the area, followed by guided discussions and exercises led by the participants themselves, with the ultimate aim of fostering impactful collaborations between the Delegates.

We hosted 28 sessions, exploring topics including:

The Summit concluded with a spectacular Closing Ceremony at the iconic BMW Welt.

Hosted by local talent Flo Akinbiyi, the Ceremony featured incredible performances, reflections on the week gone by, and a celebratory gathering of the newly named 2025 One Young World Ambassadors.

Ilka Horstmeier arrived in a custom-designed BMW featuring traditional South African patterns by South African artist Esther Mahlangu - surprising the audience and kicking off the event in style.

A traditional Bavarian band welcomed everyone and paid tribute to Munich, the wonderful host city of this year's Summit.

Terry and Rebecca King-Crews joined Co-Founders Kate and David on stage to facilitate the iconic ribbon ceremony, symbolising the commitment of all 2,000 young leaders to transform their Summit inspiration into action.

We were honoured to welcome Her Royal Highness Princess Sophie-Alexandra of Bavaria, who shared

heartfelt words about Munich before handing over to Dr. Christiaan Scharf representing the City of Munich to facilitate the baton handover to Cape Town.

Mayor Geordin Hill-Lewis proudly accepted the baton and spoke passionately about the importance of One Young World, not only for Cape Town, but for South Africa and the African continent as a whole.

The audience then heard virtually from the President of South Africa, Cyril Ramaphosa, who spoke on the vital role of youth in shaping the future.

To celebrate the 2026 Host City, Cape Town, Mtunzi Fesi and friends performed the vibrant and much-loved song Shosholozu. A couple of Delegates even joined them on stage to dance and sing along!

The Ceremony concluded with a celebration party for all Delegates, an unforgettable finale to an inspiring week.

Media Coverage



Broadcast Media

Media activity at the 2025 One Young World Summit in Munich was extensive, with 29 journalists on the ground and over 60 interviews conducted throughout the week.

Broadcast coverage was strong with 11 major pieces of coverage across CNN, BBC World TV, Bloomberg TV, Sky News, Fuji TV, Times Radio, and LBC. Additional coverage is expected with upcoming segments featuring Maria Ressa, Bill Browder, and Professor Thuli Madonsela for The Open Mind on PBS and Bloomberg early next year.

Podcast episodes on the BBC’s Global News Podcast and The Happy Pod, and DW Inside Europe in the days after showcased the breadth of voices and expertise at the Summit. Print and online features looked at specific content issues in depth in The Observer, Newsweek, PA, The New World, City AM and Semafor. An opinion piece authored on behalf of David Beasley on the challenges of global humanitarian efforts was published in TIME.

The BBC World Service team had their own stand in the Community Square where three of their journalists were on the ground hearing stories from some of the 2,200 attendees on site. The BBC team also conducted their own skills session, teaching Delegates how to pitch a story to the media, which was very well received.

Coverage continues to go live. To date, the Summit has been featured in 90 stories across top-tier media outlets including:



Social Media

Our social media channels amplified the reach of the Summit across our digital community on Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, TikTok, and X. During the four days of the event, we produced over 250 pieces of content, growing our audience by 8.6k followers. Our inspiring posts generated over 4.4 million impressions and 40,000 engagements, motivating audiences to take meaningful action.

The One Young World Digital Communications Team also interviewed iconic Counsellors including Terry Crews, Nathalie Emmanuel, and Rio Ferdinand, capturing their insights and advice on driving lasting change.

The Opening Ceremony was live-streamed to our global Community, supported by real-time social media coverage across all platforms.

Munich City Branding

The One Young World Summit had a branded presence across the city of Munich.

Highlights included a large banner displayed on the City Hall near the Marienplatz, and ELLA im Lenbachhaus, the venue of the Counsellor VIP dinner, being lit up in One Young World blue.

One Young World Ribbon Partners Deloitte and Siemens branded their respective offices, with Deloitte showcasing two Delegates on a poster, and Siemens creating a video projection outside their building.



Sustainability and Accessibility



Sustainability at the Summit

Sustainability is a top priority at One Young World and is a core part of our operations. We are committed to playing our part in delivering on the United Nations Paris Agreement as rapidly as possible. Here are some of the steps that were taken this year:

- All venues were within walking distance or close to public transport from the hotels
- Badges and lanyards at the Summit were made from paper and sustainable cotton
- All bins at venues were multi-purpose and took recycling, which was then processed and sorted by the venue
- The One Young World merchandise store clothing was zero waste, made from certified organic cotton and printed in a renewable energy-powered factory
- Catering was locally sourced and provided in biodegradable containers with wooden cutlery
- Reusable drinks bottles were supplied by Pernod Ricard to be used at water and refreshment refill stations. Delegates at the Summit were also recommended to bring their own drink bottles and hot beverage cups
- Coca Cola provided recycling bins
- All Summit venues had sustainability policies which met our strict requirements. All suppliers were asked to sign the One Young World Sustainability Pledge and told that if their commitments to the pledge were not met they would be removed from the site
- Delegates were given the opportunity to email the dedicated sustainability inbox to raise any concerns or ideas regarding sustainability at the Summit



Accessibility at the Summit

Our aim is to make the Summit accessible to all and help to make Delegates' journeys as smooth as possible between all our venues and throughout the duration of the Summit.

In order to make the Summit as accessible as possible, One Young World implemented the following procedures at the Munich Summit:

- All One Young World Munich venues and stages were fully accessible.
- International sign interpretation took place at the Opening Ceremony and on the Presentation Stage
- Closed caption text was available on the Presentation Stage and Interactive Stages
- Height adjustable lecterns on the Presentation Stage
- A low sensory room, male and female prayer rooms and a family room were available at the ICM Messe Munich
- A buddy scheme was provided where requested
- Personalised accessible transport schedules were provided where requested
- An access guide was provided outlining accessibility information for the airport, Summit venue, opening and closing ceremonies, and Delegate dinners
